

AACUC Expands With a New Chapter in Texas

AACUC announced it has established a new branch Texas. The Texas Regional Chapter was formerly under the Southern Regional Chapter and, according to a statement, "will further spread the message of diversity, equity and inclusion to the 425 credit unions based in Texas, including 225 low-income designation credit unions and 18 community development financial institution credit unions."


